# Notice of Proposed Changes to By-Laws

Our current by-laws require Monaco International to have two general business meetings per year. Historically, our pre-rallies are held the week preceding the International FMCA Conventions. Because FMCA has elected to have only one convention in 2012, the by-laws for Monaco International need to be amended.

## **1<sup>st</sup> Proposed Change:**

Article VI – CHAPTER ADMINISTRATION, PARAGRAPH 4, - CHAPTER MEETINGS

B) BUSINESS MEETINGS:

### **Currently States:**

The Chapter must hold at least 2 business meetings each membership year at which a quorum is present. Said meetings must be at least 14 days apart and be duly announced in advance to the membership

### **Change to read:**

The Chapter must hold at least 1 business meeting each membership year at which a quorum is present.

***Rationale: FMCA no longer requires a chapter to have 2 business meetings each membership year.***

## **2<sup>nd</sup> Proposed Change**

Article VI – Chapter Administration, paragraph 5 – Maintaining Affiliation

### **Currently States:**

The Chapter Secretary shall furnish to the National Office of FMCA, no later than the last week in December, a membership list, a list of chapter officers, and assurance that 2 business meetings were held.

### **Change to read:**

The Chapter Secretary shall furnish to the National Office of FMCA, no later than the last week in December, a membership list, a list of chapter officers, and assurance that at least 1 business meeting was held.

***Rationale: With FMCA only requiring a chapter to have 1 business meeting each membership year, the chapter secretary only needs to certify that at least 1 business meeting was held.***
